INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

The *Journal of the Historical Society of South Australia* (JHSSA) is a refereed journal published annually (normally in November). Articles are peer reviewed by two referees.

The JHSSA publishes original articles on South Australia's history, as well as book reviews commissioned by the editor. The readership is broad-based. Authors should use accessible language and write in a lively and concise manner.

The HSSA invites authors to submit articles of up to 8,000 words including the endnotes. Articles should follow the journal's style guide. (See separate style guide document on the HSSA website.)

Manuscripts should be prepared using Microsoft Word and submitted electronically as a Microsoft Word document (.doc or .docx) file.

The title page of the manuscript should include:

- the article title
- an abstract of 100-150 words
- the author's: name, affiliation (if relevant) and contact email address.

The JHSSA referencing style is endnotes. Endnotes are inserted at the end of the article and should be used primarily to cite sources. Discursive notes should be avoided. Instructions about notes are expanded upon in the style guide.

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Acknowledgements should be noted at the end of an article and before the endnotes. Include acknowledgements sparingly and as required (e.g. to recognise research funding sources).

The initial submission for peer review should include:

- (1) The manuscript with title page. (See information above about title page inclusions.)
- (2) An electronic file or files containing proposed images. (See illustrations information above for file sizes and formats.)

A Publishing Agreement will be sent to authors whose article is accepted for publication.
